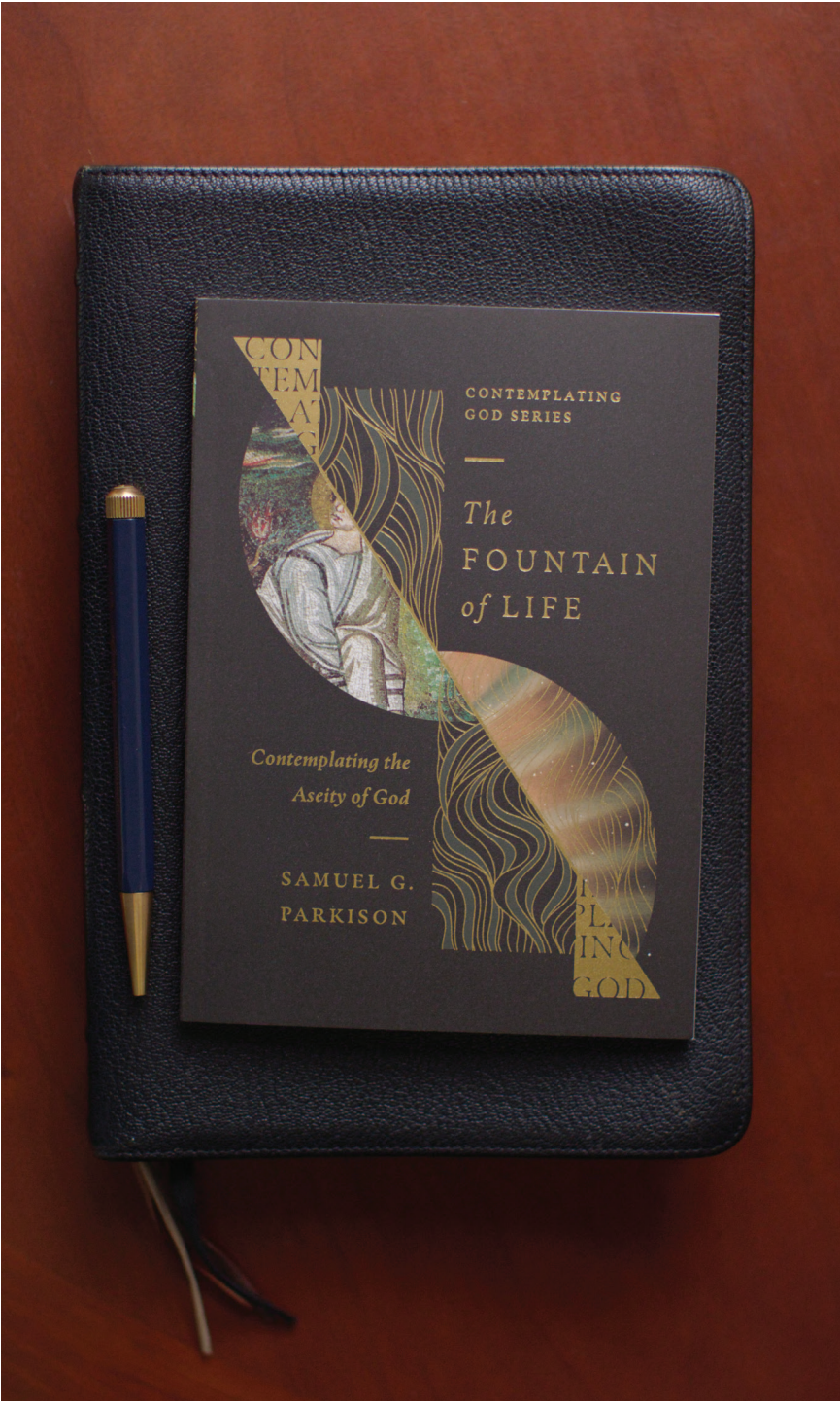

Especially good on this score are the three newest entries in our New Testament Theology series. In Robert Plummer's excellent overview of the book of James he centers attention on how the believer expresses their life of faith. But these insights in *Living Faith* come only after an opening chapter in which he offers an invaluable constructive account of the book's Christology, demonstrating that the book of James is a faithful recapitulation of Jesus's teaching.

In *Strengthened by the Gospel*, Brian Rosner provides a superb introduction to the letter of Romans. Its strength lies not only in Rosner compellingly presenting the gospel as the center of Paul's argument in Romans, but also in the remarkable fact that Rosner provides a comprehensive tour of Romans in a single, 200-page book. For this reason, among others, Doug Moo calls it the best available survey of the theology of Romans.

Finally, releasing in June is Jonathan Pennington's thoughtful contribution on the Gospel of Matthew, titled *Becoming a Disciple of the King*. Guiding the reader through the theology of the First Gospel, Pennington shows how Matthew purposefully and skillfully focuses his Gospel on Christology as he invites readers into a life of discipleship by following Jesus's own life and teachings.

The content and character of each of these titles—along with the many others listed on the following pages—are why we are so pleased to present these titles to you, and are confident they can be used in the classroom, study, and church, for building up the body of Christ and attaining the unity that comes with the knowledge of the Son of God.

These are hidden reefs at your love feasts, as they feast with you without fear, shepherds feeding themselves; worthless clouds, swept along by winds; fruitless trees in late autumn, twice dead, uprooted; wild waves of the sea, casting up the foam of their own shame; wandering stars, for whom the gloom of utter darkness has been reserved forever.

Dear 33 ■ It was also about these that Enoch, the seventh from Adam, prophesied, saying, "Behold, the Lord comes with ten thousands of his holy ones, to execute judgment on all and to convict all the ungodly of all their deeds of ungodliness that they have committed in such an ungodly way, and of all the harsh things that ungodly sinners have spoken against him." But you, beloved, building yourselves up in your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit, keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life. And have mercy on those who doubt; save others by snatching them out of the fire; to others show mercy with fear, hating even the garment stained by the flesh.

Eph 5 and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory with great joy, to the only God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen.

The Revelation to John



he revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show to his servants the things that must soon take place. He made it known by sending his angel to his servant John, who bore witness to the word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that he saw. Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear, and who keep what is written in it, for the time is near.

■ John to the seven churches that are in Asia:
■ Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth.

■ To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood and made us a kingdom, priests to his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. Behold, he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him, and all tribes of the earth will wail on account of him. Even so. Amen.

■ "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."

■ Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest. The hair of his head was white, like white wool, like snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, his feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and his voice was like the roar of many waters. In his right hand he held seven stars, from his mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and his face was like the sun shining in full strength.

Exod 15 ■ When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But
Dan 10 he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. Write therefore the things that you have seen, those that are and those that are to take place after this. As for the mystery of the seven stars that you saw in my right hand, and the seven golden lampstands, the seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches.

CHAPTER II

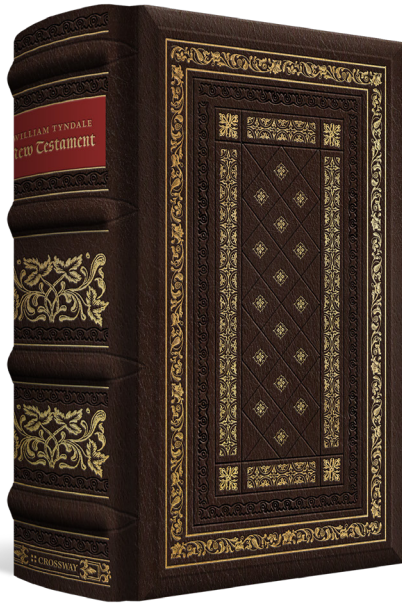
■ To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: "The words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands.
■ "I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance, and how you cannot bear with those who are evil, but have tested those who call themselves apostles and are not, and found them to be false. I know you are enduring patiently and bearing up for my name's sake,

and you have not grown weary. But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first. Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent. Yet this you have: you hate the works of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who conquers I will grant to eat of the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God."

■ "And to the angel of the church in Smyrna write: 'The words of the first and the last, who died and came to life.
■ "I know your tribulation and your poverty (but you are rich) and the slander of those who say that they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan. Do not fear what you are about to suffer. Behold, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may be tested, and for ten days you will have tribulation. Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life. He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. The one who conquers will not be hurt by the second death."

■ "And to the angel of the church in Pergamum write: "The words of him who has the sharp two-edged sword.
■ "I know where you dwell, where Satan's throne is. Yet you hold fast my name, and you did not deny my faith even in the days of Antipas my faithful witness, who was killed among you, where Satan dwells. But I have a few things against you: you have some there who hold the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, so that they might eat food sacrificed to idols and practice sexual immorality. So also

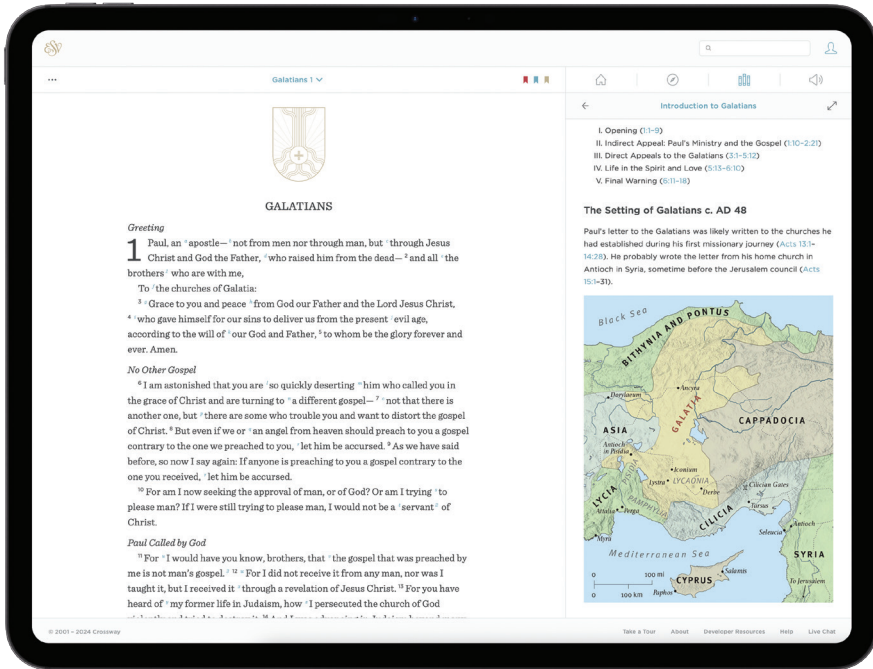


William Tyndale New Testament, 500th Anniversary Edition

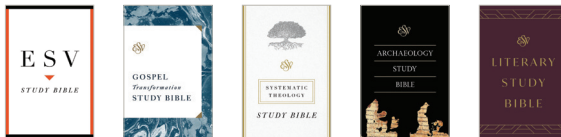

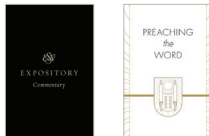
