

Observing Advent Aright

The word Advent comes from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning "coming." The Scriptures speak of the coming of Christ in two ways. Christ came to this world the first time in his incarnation and birth. Galatians 4:4–5: "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons." This is the first coming of Christ. But there is also a second coming. Jesus spoke of the future "coming" (Parousia) of the Son of Man (Matt. 24:37).

These two comings of Christ are contrasted yet connected. They are contrasted in the manner of his coming. His first coming was, in many ways, hidden and silent. As the opening words of the third verse of Phillip Brooks's well-known carol "O Little Town of Bethlehem" puts it: "How silently, how silently, the wondrous gift is given." But not so Christ's second coming. It will be public and loud. Charles Wesley's hymn "Lo, He Comes with Clouds Descending," captures it well at the beginning of verse 2: "Ev'ry eye shall now behold him, rob'd in dreadful majesty."

If he came the first time in quiet humility to the few, he will come the second time in rapturous glory to the many.

If in the first coming he was wrapped in swaddling clothes and attended by animals, in the second he will be wrapped in blinding light and attended by angels. In his first coming, he was seen in a lowly manger by the magi; in his second coming, he will be seen on an exalted throne by the multitudes.


But the two comings, while distinctly contrasted, are also inseparably connected. They are connected in the way they bookend Christ's redemptive work. In his first coming Christ came to inaugurate his kingdom (Mark 1:15) and secure redemption for his people (John 6:39). What Christ began to do in his first coming, he will return to complete in his second coming.

And this is where observing Advent aright can help us. In its fullest sense, Advent is a season to meditate on the second coming of Christ while we muse on his first coming. To think only of Christ's first coming in humility during Advent and not his second coming in glory is to disconnect the bookends of the gospel; it is to neglect the end of our salvation and so negate the beginning of our salvation—it is only half to observe Advent. And so, this Advent season, let us not separate what God has joined together in his gospel.

The Sorrow of Mental Illness and the Hope of Christmas

"Joy to the world?" All I know is a world of sadness. "The Prince of Peace?" Fear and confusion reign in my heart. "God with us?" It feels like God has left me.

The sorrow of mental illness often suffocates the hope of Christmas, sometimes leaving us in even deeper despair than at other times of the year. How can we recover and rekindle the hope of Christmas while engulfed in the sorrow of mental illness?

Thankfully, the Christmas message of Jesus's coming speaks three hope-fueling truths into our lives.

"I see your suffering."

One of the greatest pains in mental illness is that we cannot point to something visible and say, "See, there it is. That's the problem." Observers cannot see our irrational thoughts or our anxious emotions, making us feel unseen in our suffering. The invisibility of our pain and the feeling of painful invisibility is especially felt at Christmas when everyone else is focused on celebration.

Into this invisibility comes the invisible God in visible form. By his coming in the flesh, he effectively says, "I see you. I see your pain. I see your suffering. Neither you nor your sufferings are invisible to me. I've come to shine my light upon you and into you" (Matt. 4:16).

"I sympathize with your pain."

Some do see our mental and emotional suffering, but they can't understand it because they've never experienced it themselves.

However much they want to understand, they really don't get the depth of our darkness. We feel lonely even among our loved ones.

Into this desolate isolation comes the perfect sympathizer (Heb. 4:16). His coming into our human experience of the worst physical, mental, emotional, relational, and spiritual pain assures us that he really "gets it" and really "gets us."

"I save from pain."

Not all mental illness is the result of personal sin, but all mental illness is the consequence of sin in the world. At Christmas we find hope of healing in Christ's coming to save us both from our sins and their consequences.

If our mental illness is the result of sin and unresolved guilt, then Christmas gives us hope of full, free, and forever forgiveness through Jesus coming to carry our sin and guilt away.


If our mental illness is simply one of the consequences of living in broken bodies in a broken world, then we can ask the great physician to heal us directly or through medicine and other gifts of his grace.

Even if he says, "Not yet," we know that because he came to save us from all sin and all its consequences, we can look forward to heaven where he will wipe every tear from our eyes, brains, and hearts, when he removes all illness, physical and mental, from our lives (Rev. 21:4).

Use the triple hope of our Savior's sight, sympathy, and salvation to counsel you through the sorrow of mental illness at Christmas time.
